

# Services Held For Martha Whitman

Funeral services were conducted Monday at the Presbyterian church for Mrs. Martha Jamieson Whitman, who passed away March 2 at Gradera, Calif., following a lingering illness. Rev. J. A. Howard was in charge.

Mrs. Whitman was born Feb. 10, 1863, at Oquawka, Ill. As a young woman she worked as a stenographer at Paris, and was court stenographer at Pocatello, transcribing the territorial records at the time of Idaho's admittance to statehood. She was deputy clerk of the circuit court for the territory of Idaho before Idaho's statehood.

As president of the Equal Suffrage association, she saw victory for her cause during the time she was president. She was active in the Women's Christian Temperance Union, and in community and civic affairs wherever she made her home. She was also very active in the Presbyterian church and its organizations, and at the time of her death was a member of the Presbyterian church of Salt Lake City.

She was married in 1890 to Marcus Frederick Whitman, who preceded her in death on December 19, 1930. She is survived by a son, Marcus Jamieson Whitman, Tooele, Utah; two daughters, Mrs. Florence Crandall, Tooele, Utah, and Mrs. Marguerite Garvin of Gardena, Calif.; also seven grandchildren and one great grandchild.

Interment was in the Soda Springs Fairview cemetery.
